## Study Group Notes

### NEW PUBLICATION:

A 68 page monograph entitled "Tysk Feldpost i Sor-Norge - Abschnitt Stavanger 1940-45" (German Fieldpost in Southern Norway - the Stavanger Region 1940-45) has recently been published by Torbjorn Larsson-Fedde. This work is nicely done with texts in both Norwegian and German and while not in English, has much useful information in the form of charts and listings of German military units with Feldpost numbers and actual locations. Included is a historical section describing the German occupation of this section of Norway, which extends from Stavanger to Christiansand. Also included is a copy of the Norwegian postal regulations covering permissible mail between Norwegian civilians and German military personnel. Upon reading over this fine work, we would heartily recommend it to our Feldpost-collecting members. Price (including printed matter airmail to the U.S.) is 31.70 Norwegian kr. 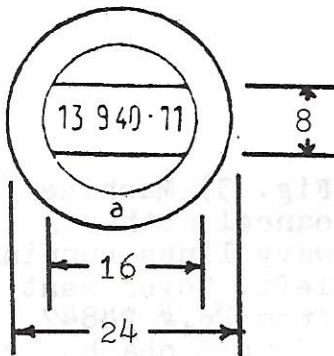

## Muted Postmarks

In TRSG Bulletin No. 46 (p. 15-18) the use of special "stummenstempel" (mute cancels) on feldpost with 5-digit return addresses was discussed. These "stumme" cancels exist in many varieties and offer many collecting possibilities. In his classic "Kleines Handbuch der Deutschen Feldpost", Alfred Clement has an appendix listing "stumme" cancels. These are listed according to design and size measured in millimeters.

Clement denotes cancel sizes in terms of outer diameter, inner diameter and width of date bridge. For example, the double-ring/date bridge design shown below is listed in Clement as "24/16/8".



Were this cancel a single ring/date bridge design, Clement would give the size as "24/0/8". His method provides a ready means for identifying cancels in one's collection.

Further identification is possible on those cancels with "Schalterbuchstaben" (counter letters). These are usually located at the bottom of the cancel.

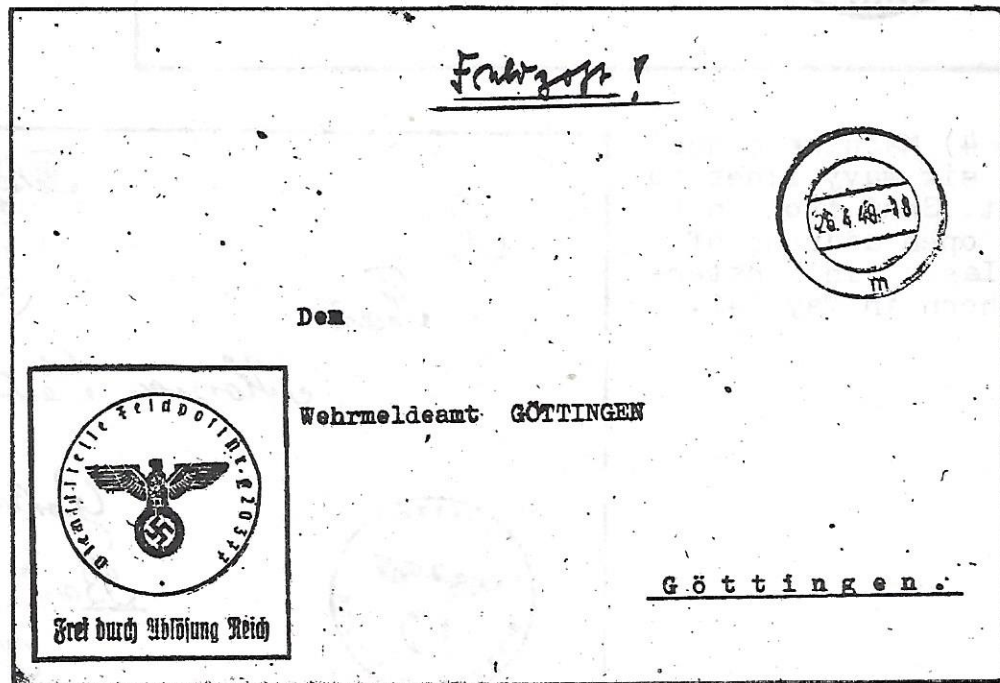
Finally, machine and roller cancels differ in the number, location and shape of the lines adjacent to the date cancels.

With all of this technical info out of the way, we can now proceed with a review of the major "stumme" cancel designs.

### I.) Double-ring/date bridge

This "Ringsteg" cancel is one of the commonest types, found in hand, machine, slogan and roller styles. Shown below (Fig. 1) is an official cover sent April '40 from Fp.# L20377 (4. Flughafen Betr. Kp./Kampf Geschwader 4). Note letter code "m" which Clements lists as having been used in Austria.

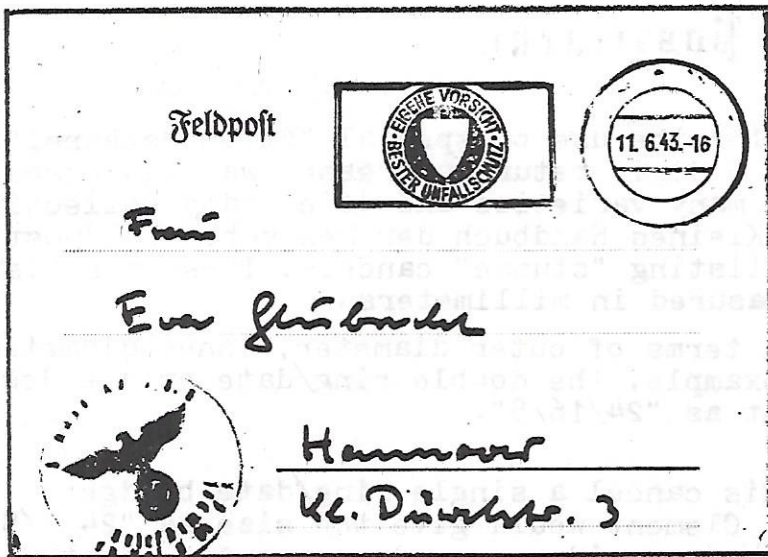


Fig. 2) Slogan cancel on cover with open unit identity of Luftwaffe Signals Rgt. sent June '43. Clement lists this cancel as used in Mainz.

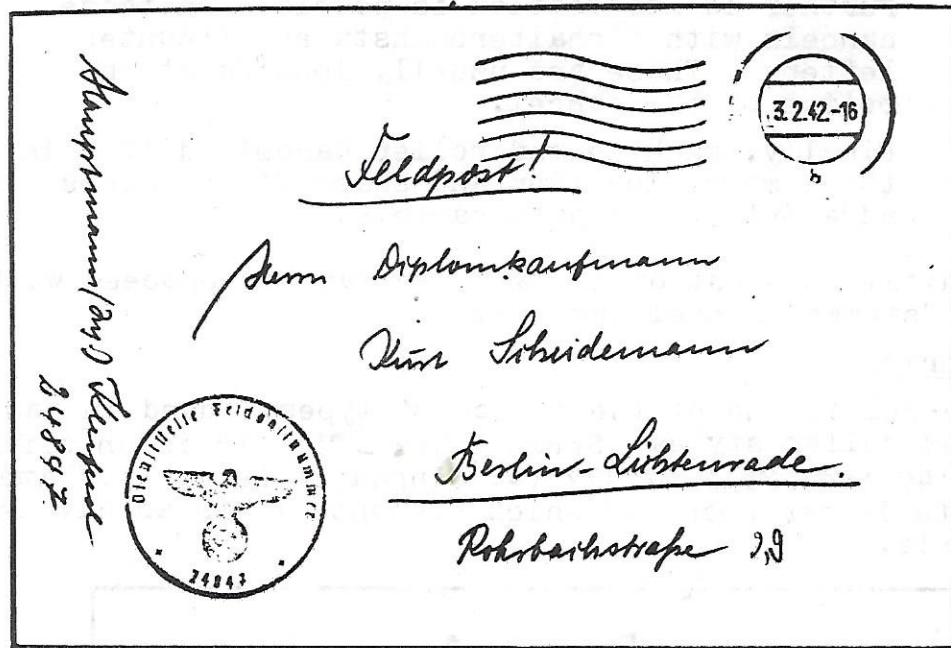
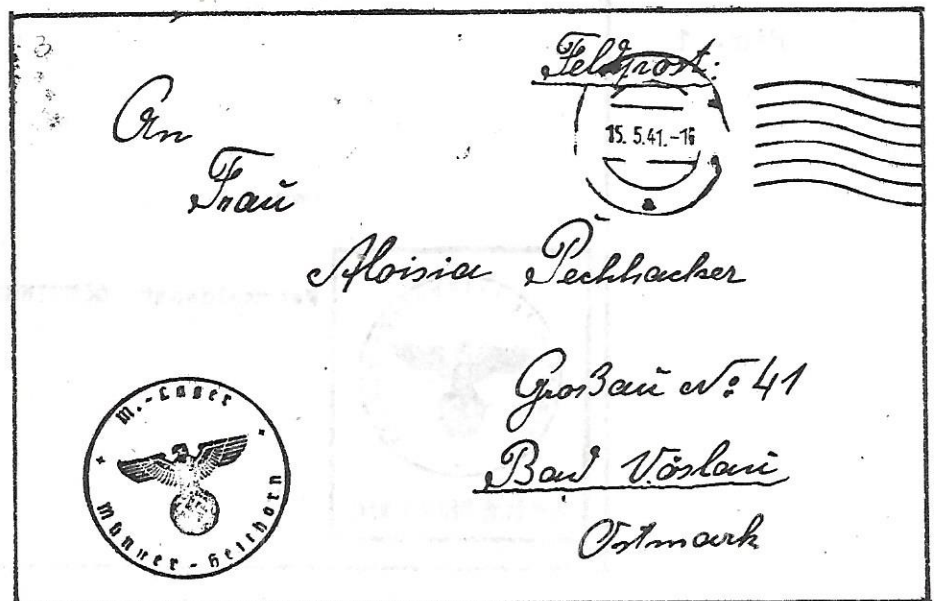


Fig. 3) Machine cancel with six wavy lines running left. Cover sent from Fp.# 24847 (Stab/Beobachtung Abt. 1) in Feb. '42. Clements doesn't identify this cancel with code "b".

Fig. 4) Machine cancel with six wavy lines to right. Sent from unit with open address of "M.-Lager" in Münster-Heithorn in May '41.



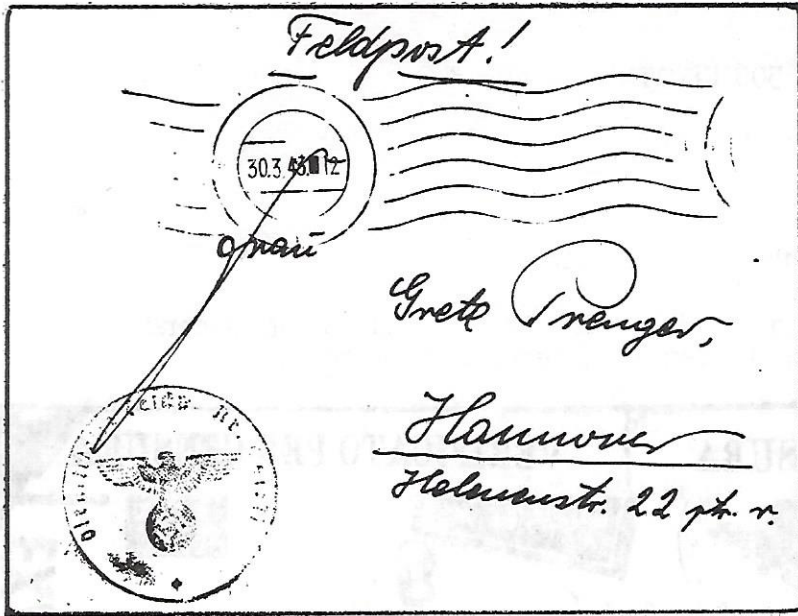


Fig. 5) Roller cancel with six wavy lines on cover sent from Fp.# L41371 (Transport Kol. III/Luftnachrichten Rgt. 14) in March '43. Clement lists this cancel as being used in the Generalgouvernement.

Clement lists this cancel as used in Hannover.

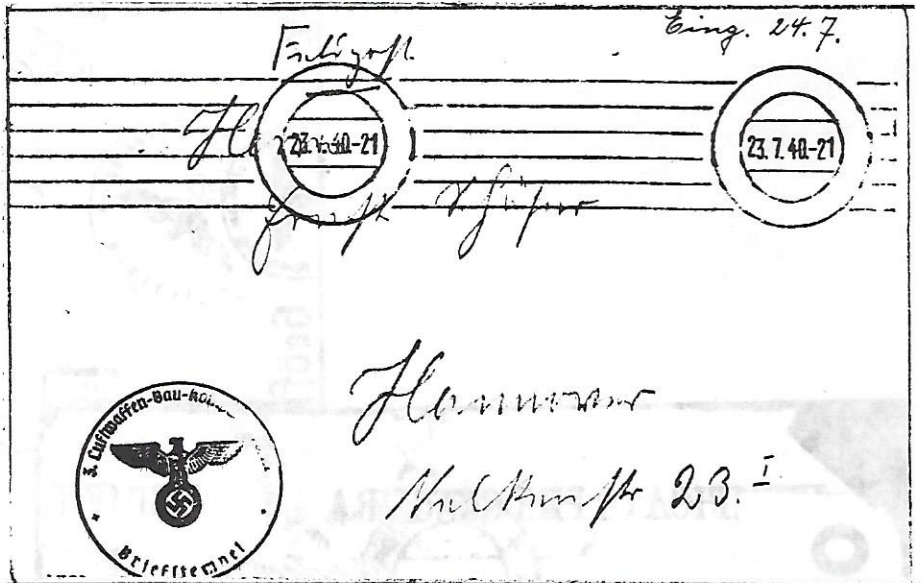


Fig. 7) Unusual roller cancel with seven broken lines is modified city cancel with top and bottom of circles machined off. Cover sent from L16516 (Stab/(Res.) schw. Flak Abt. 222) in March '43.

Clement lists this cancel as used in Berlin-Charlottenburg.

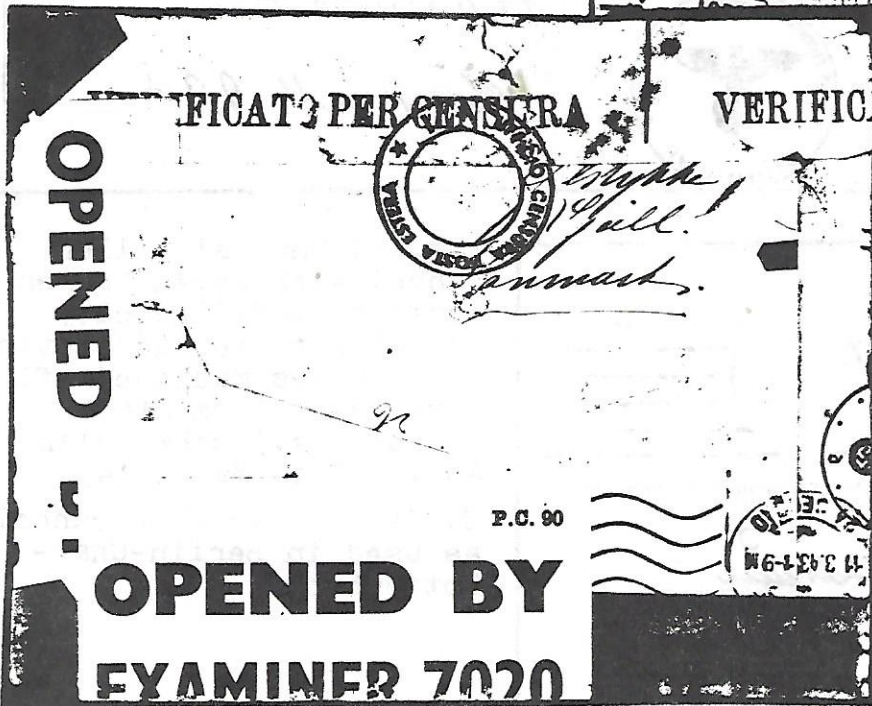
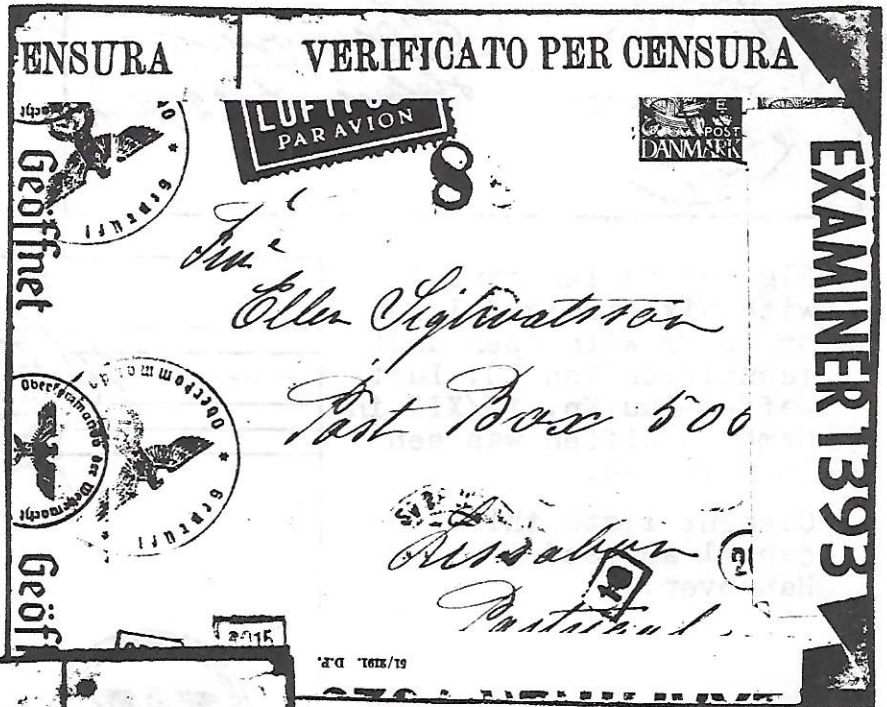
P.O. BOX 506 UPDATE

Old covers are being rediscovered all the time.

Thanks to the articles appearing in Bulletins No. 47 and 49, my second Lisbon P. O. Box 506 find can be duplicated in a reduced form here.

The January 9, 1943 cancel from Ølstykke can be seen under the Italian censor tape.



Three months later on March 11 the cover was back stamped in Portugal, after being opened by Germans in Munich, Italians and two British examiners.

## Perfined Hitler Heads

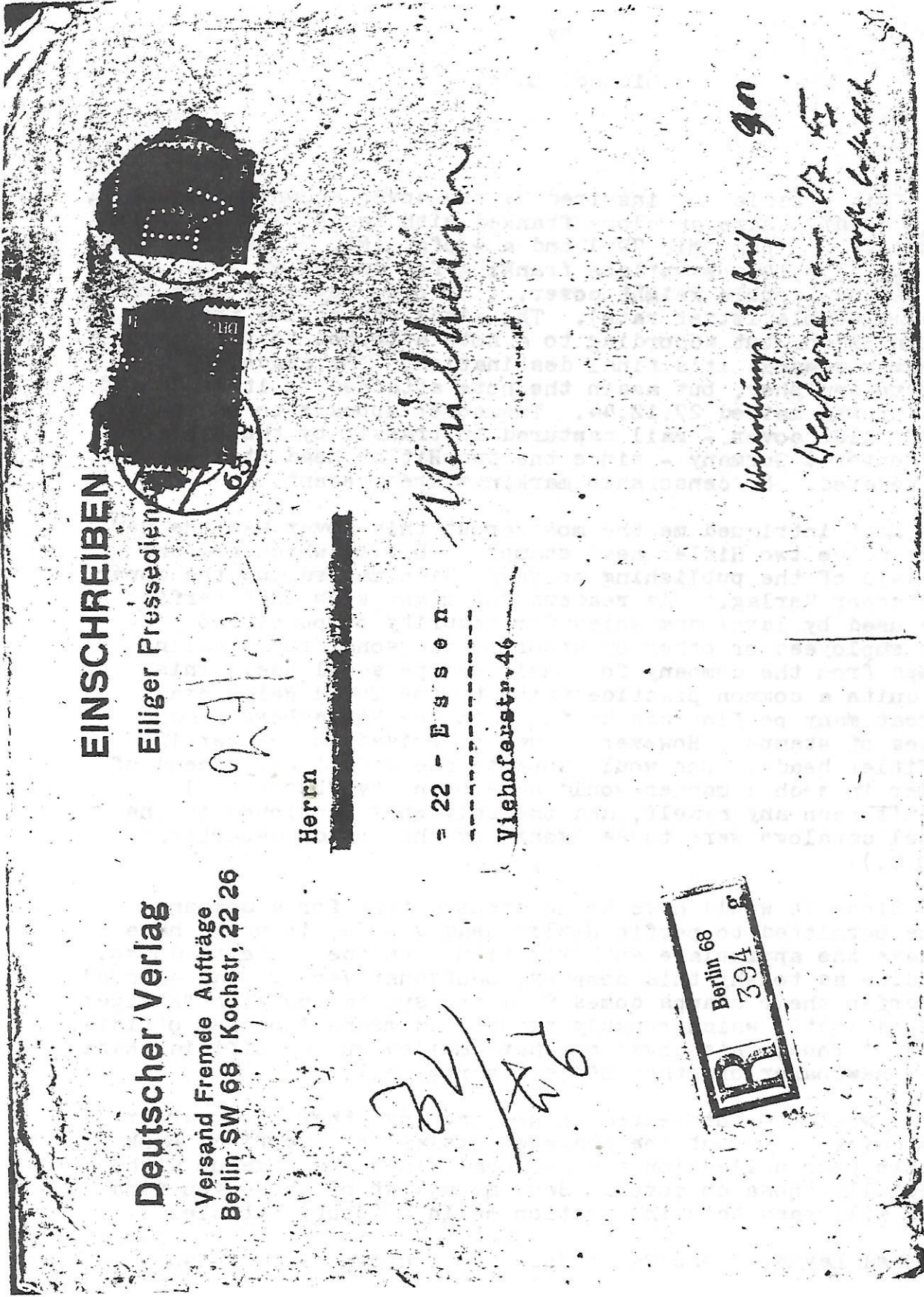
This article was inspired by the cover shown in Figure I. It is a large size envelope franked with two Hitler head stamps - a 50 pfg (Mi. 796) and a 4 pfg. (Mi. 783) stamp. The 54 pfg. rate is appropriate franking for an out-of-town, registered, double weight cover, (30 pfg. registry rate and 24 pfg. double letter rate). The piece was mailed from Berlin SW 68, but according to a note attached to the cover it never reached it's final destination. The cancel is very hard to decipher, but again the note attached to it indicated that it was mailed 27.12.44. The cover appears to be an "uberrollier" cover, - mail captured in transit by the Allies as they entered Germany - since the two Hitler head stamps were obliterated. No censorship markings are present.

What intrigued me the most about this cover was the perfins on the two Hitler head stamps - "D.V.", which are the initials of the publishing company which mailed out the cover, "Deutscher Verlag." As readers you might know that perfins were used by large companies for security purposes, to prevent employees or other unauthorized persons from stealing stamps from the company for their own personal use. This was quite a common practice prior to the Third Reich era. A great many perfins can be found on the Hindenberg head series of stamps. However, I was surprised to see perfins on Hitler heads. One would suppose the defacing the head of Hitler in such a manner would have been "verboten". I haven't seen any myself, and the only ones mentioned in the Michel catalogue were those issued by the police department (P.O.L.).

Since it would have to be assumed that for a company to be permitted to perfin Hitler head stamps, it would have to have the appropriate authorization from the state to do so. One clue as to why this company, Deutscher Verlag, was allowed to perfin their stamps comes from the special marking "Eiliger Pressedeinst", which roughly translated means "special official press." Thus, this cover may have mailed out an official Nazi party newspaper or other official party mail.

I would be interested in hearing any other ideas about this cover and about the usage of Hitler head perfins. Look through your collection and see what kinds you come up with, especially those on cover. Send me a list of those you find and I will pass this information on in a future article..

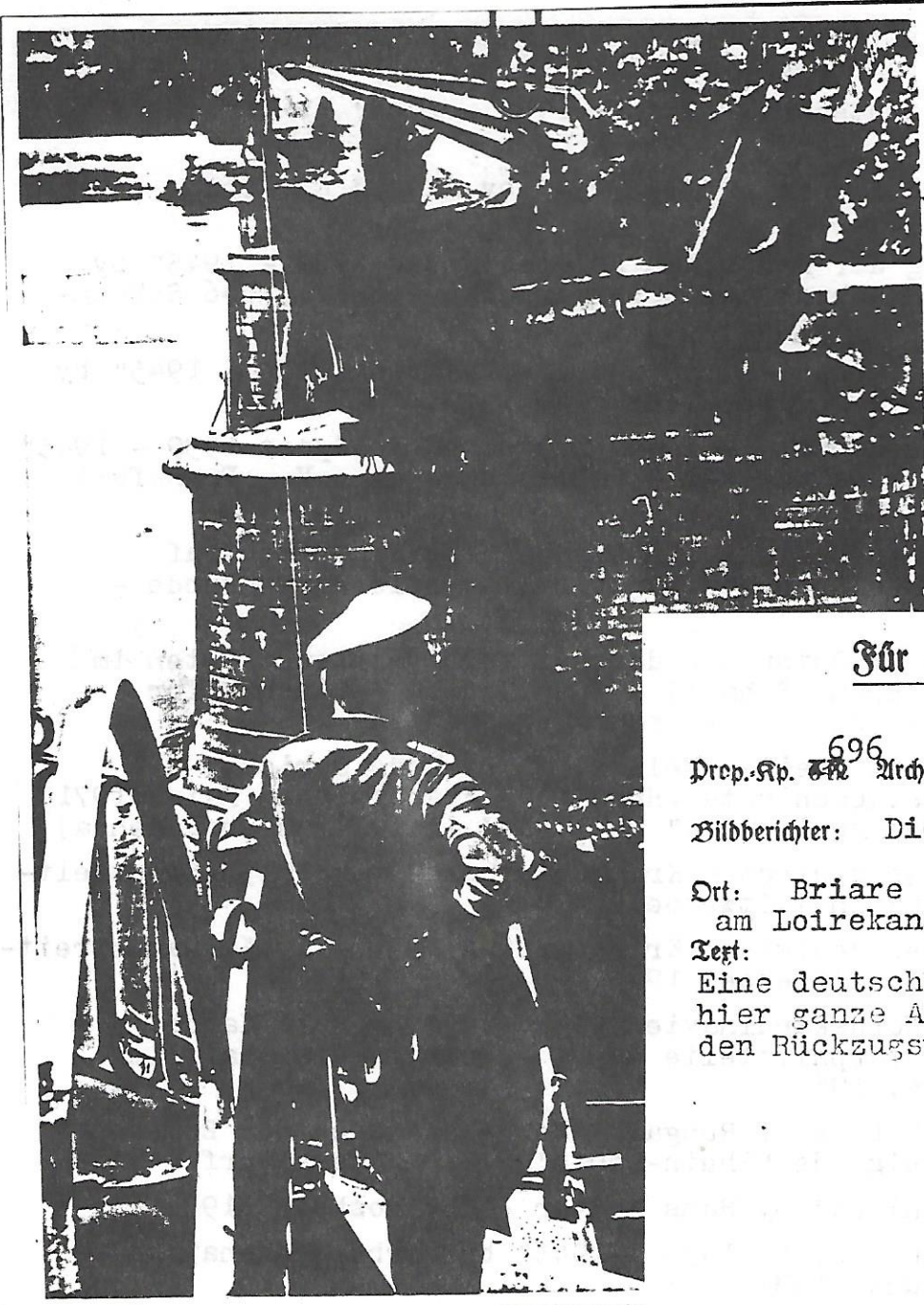

## "AUSLANDS-ORGANISATION" - STORY BEHIND THE CANCEL

The special cancel shown below was used in Stuttgart from Aug. 26 to Sept. 4, 1938 to commemorate the fourth "Reichstagung der Auslandsdeutschen" (National Conference of Germans Living Abroad).

The insignia in the cancel, a diamond with the initials "A.O.", was that of the "Auslands-Organisation" whose purpose was to instill the spirit of National Socialism in Germans living outside the Reich.



The forerunner of the "A.O." was the "Auslands-abteilung der Reicheleiter der N.S.D.A.P.", an organization begun in 1930 by Willy Grothe, a German who had been interned in Africa by the British during World War I. Headquartered in Hamburg, this organization was recognized by the Nazis at a meeting held on May 1, 1931 and given the status of a department of the Reich Directorate.

Leadership of the Auslandsabteilung passed to Ernst Bohle, who had grown up in South Africa and moved to Germany in 1924. In 1933, the Auslandsabteilung had 3,000 members living abroad. In 1935 the title was changed to "Auslands-Organisation der N.S.D.A.P." but normally referred to as the "A.O.". During the Nuremberg Rally of 1936, the "A.O." was honored by Rudolf Hess and 48 local groups paraded their standards.

**CAVEAT EMPTOR!**

The popularity of the more colorful postcards of the Third Reich era, both official and private productions, and the constantly rising prices that they command, has created a demand among collectors for the reprints that are now beginning to appear on the market.

Many of us, knowing that it is most unlikely that we shall ever come across the real thing at a price we can afford, may be quite happy to purchase a good reproduction to illustrate a missing item and the important thing is to be able to recognize the nature of the card on offer. Most dealers and auction lists will describe them correctly as "reproductions" and price them accordingly, but inevitably they will find their way into the hands of the less knowledgeable (or the less scrupulous) and be offered as the genuine article at inflated prices.

Reproductions, unlike forgeries, are not designed to deceive and should not be difficult to recognize, particularly to those familiar with the genuine items as illustrated and described in the literature. The most obvious differences will be apparent on the reverse of the card where reproductions of privately printed cards will normally lack the name and address of the original printer and official postal stationery cards will lack both the imprinted stamp(s) and the printer's details of the genuine article. The reproductions will always be in mint condition and those that have been seen are sufficiently inferior in the tone and quality of color to be instantly recognizable to the experienced collector.

SPECIAL CANCELLATIONS OF BERLIN

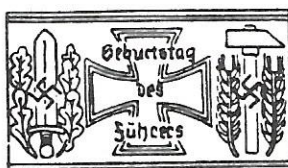

Another promising area for the "sonderstempel" enthusiast is to collect the special cancels used in a single city. Berlin would be one obvious choice as the many post offices in the capital city certainly produced a huge number of such cancels during the Nazi era. While a definitive listing is available in Bochmann's Katalog der deutschen Gelegenheitsstempel 1880-1951, the following is a random selection of Berlin cancels to give you an idea of the interesting and varied possibilities available.



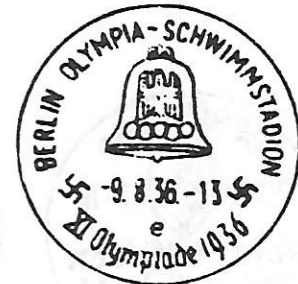

CINDERELLA CORNER... Anti-Nazi Propaganda Leaflet.

Shown below is an aerial leaflet dropped over German-occupied Norway in late 1941 by the R.A.F. The design is a parody of a 30 ØRE stamp with a large wall-sticker and three perforated stamp-size labels.

The text "Wir fahren gegen Engelland!" (we go against England) mocks the German use of this phrase during the early days of the "Battle of Britain".

THE 1940 OLYMPIC GAMES

by Edwin Parrasch

In answer to the inquiry in TRSG Bulletin #60 (p.4), the following is background on the 1940 Olympic Games.

At the close of the Summer Olympics in Berlin in 1936, it was announced that Japan had been awarded both Summer and Winter games for 1940. The military build-up and continued aggression in China by Japanese forces resulted in the International Olympic Committee's decision to relocate the 1940 games. As this decision was made in the Summer of 1938, it was obvious that any new locations would have to have suitable facilities as there was not sufficient time to start from scratch. Therefore, the Summer games were awarded to Helsinki, Finland which had just completed a 30,000 seat stadium. Garmisch-Partenkirchen, Germany, site of the '36 Winter games, was to host the 1940 Winter games.

I don't know when the 1940 Olympic Games were officially cancelled but I have covers dated as late as January '40 which have slogan cancels for the games. The Postcard from Riga, Latvia (Fig. 1) has a German censor handstamp and was posted 1/2/40. The cover from Helsinki, Finland has a machine roller cancel with "XII OLYMPIA" and scheduled date for the Summer games given as July 20th to August 8th.(Fig. 2).

The Sports Philatelists International is currently working on an article on the 1940 games and would appreciate any additional info from the TRSG membership. (Editor's note: Mr. Parrasch, while not a TRSG member, has a fine exhibition of the 1936 Olympics. During a chat at a recent exhibit, I asked Ed if he could supply any info on the mysterious 1940 games.).

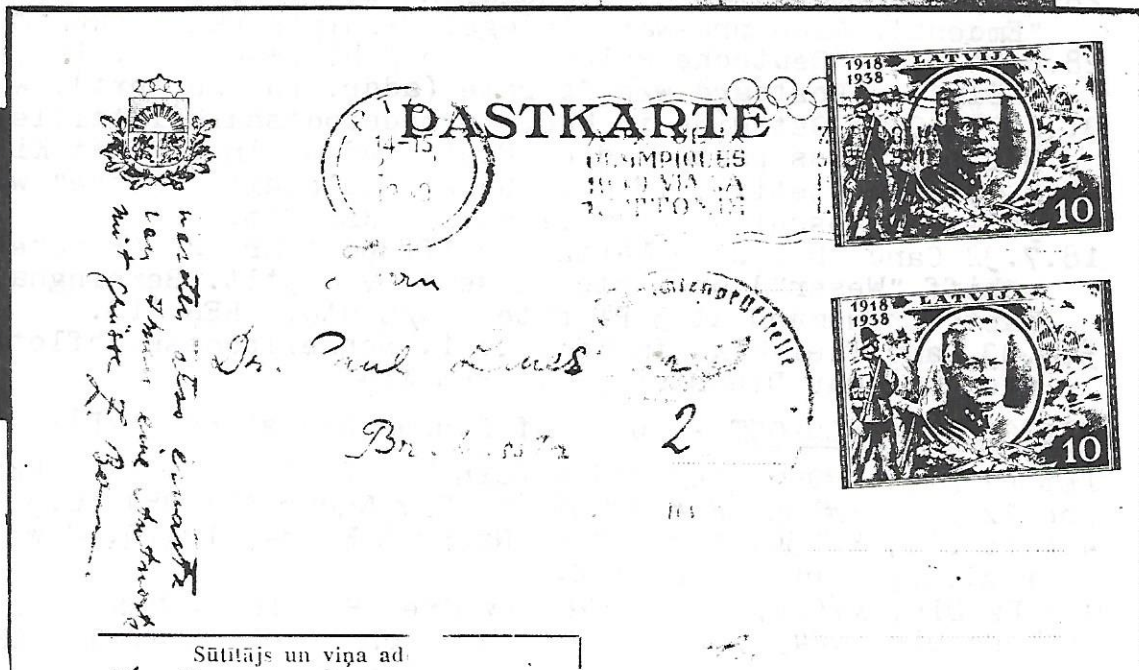
