LITERATURE NOTE:

The April 1977 issue of "The German Postal Specialist" recommended a new book by J.P. Lebrun, entitled "Die Feldpostnummern der It. Infanterie 1939-45". The price of DM 8 (plus postage) was indicated, but no information on how the book could be obtained was included. Our members should be advised firstly, that the correct title of the book is "Die Feldpostnummern der deutschen Infanterie 1939-45" and secondly, that it may be ordered from:

Thirdly, I would like to caution our members that while this work is well done, it contains only the Feldpost numbers (listed in numerical order) of the Infantry and Grenadier Regiments of the German Infantry Divisions and NOT all the other various units which composed an Infantry division. It should also be noted that since this is a French publication, the identifications are naturally in French. The source reference for this book is indicated as the FpU - Teil III, Band 2 & 3 (March-April 1942) and I see no indication of subsequent changes to 1945 being taken into consideration. For those with no other access to Feldpost number identities and whose interest might be limited to the above-mentioned components, this book would be well worth the modest cost.

DOUBLE PERFORATION STAMP ERROR

Shown below are front and back views of a perforation error on Mi 566, the 6 Pfg. value of the "Return of Saarland" issue of 1935.

Note that the normal perforation between the stamp and bottom margin is missing and that there are two horizontal perforations running through the lower portion of the design.

The stamp carries the remains of a common town postmark, but the only legible portion is the date - June 26, 1935.

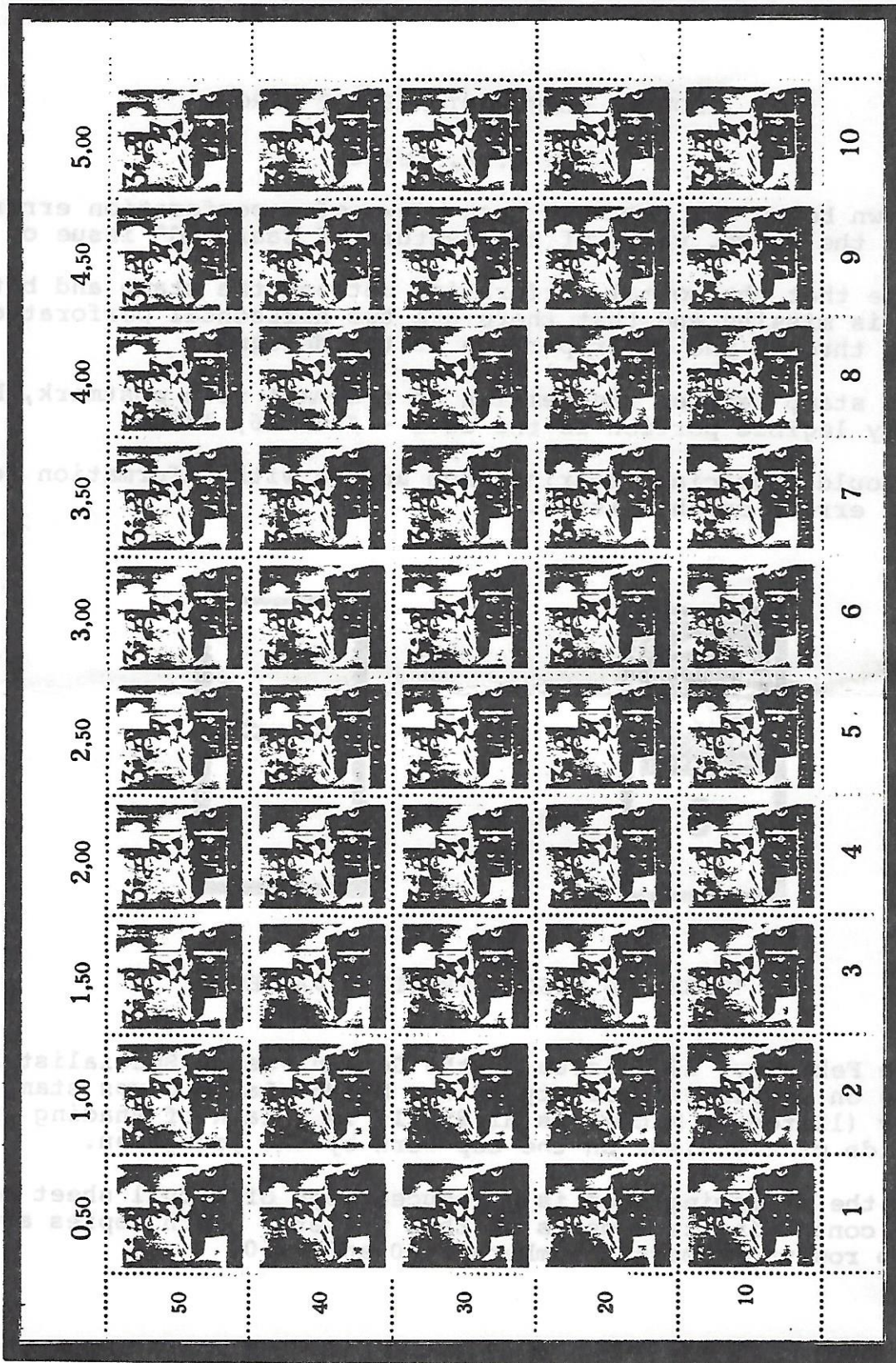

"UNSHADED VISOR" PRINTING VARIETY

The February, 1977 issue of the German Postal Specialist ran a feature on a printing variety of the Mi 850 Labor Corps stamp. The variety (listed in Michel as Mi 850 I) is a lack of shading on the underside of the visor on the cap worn by the young man.

On the following page is a reduced copy of a full sheet of Mi 850 containing two copies of this variety. Both copies are in the top row under margin numbers 2,00 and 4,50.



THE HEYDRICH MOURNING STAMP

Reinhard Heydrich, Obergruppenfuehrer SS and Deputy Reich Protector of Bohemia-Moravia, died on June 4, 1942 from wounds received in an assassination attempt on May 27th. British-trained Czech assassins had been parachuted into the Protectorate some months earlier and succeeded in their mission (code named "Anthropoids") by tossing a handgrenade into Heydrich's car as it was negotiating a hairpin curve in the outskirts of Prague.

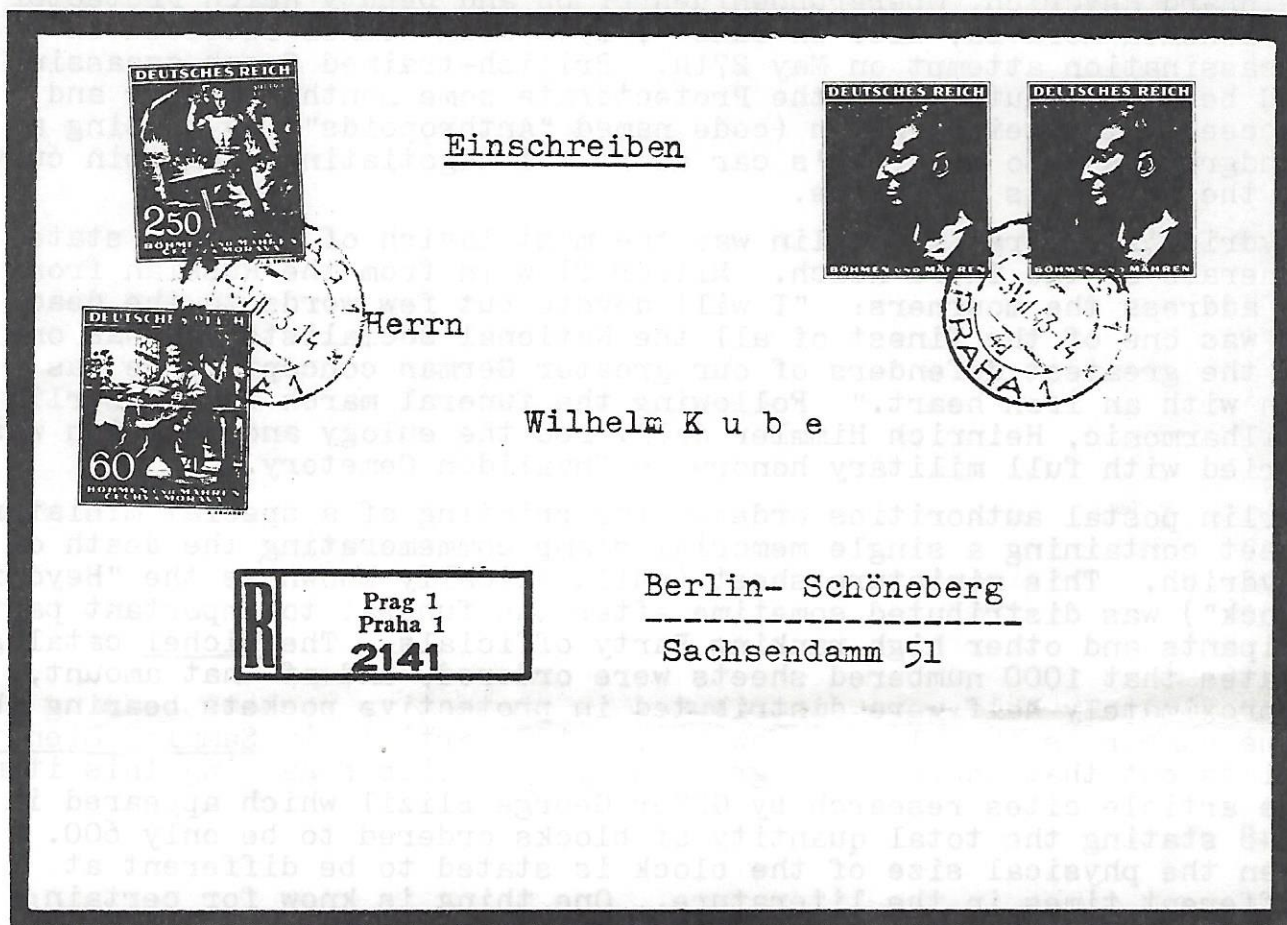
Heydrich's funeral in Berlin was the most lavish of the many state funerals of the Third Reich. Hitler flew in from the Russian front to address the mourners: "I will devote but few words to the dead. He was one of the finest of all the National Socialists, he was one of the greatest defenders of our greater German concept... He was a man with an iron heart." Following the funeral march by the Berlin Philharmonic, Heinrich Himmler delivered the eulogy and Heydrich was buried with full military honors in Invaliden Cemetery.

Berlin postal authorities ordered the printing of a special miniature sheet containing a single memorial stamp commemorating the death of Heydrich. This miniature sheet (philatelically known as the "Heydrich Block") was distributed sometime after the funeral to important participants and other high ranking Party officials. The Michel catalog states that 1000 numbered sheets were ordered, and of that amount, approximately half were distributed in protective pockets bearing the same number as the block. However, a 1972 article in Sammler-Dienst points out that there are a great many mysteries regarding this item. The article cites research by GPsEr George Blizil which appeared in 1948 stating the total quantity of blocks ordered to be only 600. Even the physical size of the block is stated to be different at different times in the literature. One thing is know for certain: the block is a great rarity and few people will have the opportunity to measure one !

A semi-postal Bohemia-Moravia commemorative stamp (Mi. 131) featuring Heydrich's death mask and SS runes, was issued on May 28, 1943. This stamp design is the same as the single imperforate stamp which appears in the block. A pair of Mi. 131's is shown below on a registered cover cancelled at Prague on July 3, 1943. These stamps are also found cancelled to order on a "Gedenkblatt" (memorial sheet). In 1976, a "Gedenkblatt" offered in a mail auction was knocked down for \$17.50 while the Michel Specialized for that year listed the sheet at DM 2,50.

E. Hamann's series of articles on the special postmarks of Bohemia-Moravia which appeared in Sammler Dienst, make no mention of a special postmark associated with the Heydrich stamp. I would appreciate hearing from anyone who has seen a special postmark or who has any additional information on the block.

LUFTELDPOST SERVICE IN SCANDANAVIA

In TRSG Bulletin No. 39, this collector raised the question of a military airmail service in Northern Scandinavia - indicating that known covers certainly seemed to confirm the existence of some such service, but that official documentation of any kind was lacking.

While Alfred Clement, in his original "Kleines Handbuch der Deutschen Feldpost 1937-1945", described the air permit stamps as being issued for use in "Greece, Africa and Scandinavia" as well as for the Eastern front, it became apparent over the years that the air service for the troops on the Eastern front did not have an exact parallel in the other war theatres. Clement's reference to "Greece" is construed to more exactly mean the Aegean Islands (Inselpost) and his reference to Africa has had no substantiation whatsoever.

While examining the contents of roll #1071 of U.S. Archives microfilm series T-312 (operations reports of the 20th Mountain Army), I finally found a reference to the airmail service for troops of the 20th Mountain Army in Finland and Northern Norway, which surprisingly indicated that the service was initiated in September, 1943 (a year earlier than known covers had indicated) and utilized Lufthansa flights extended on from their normal termination at Helsinki, northwards to Tornio, Finland. With the German army evacuating from Finland to Northern Norway in late 1944, it is presumed that the northern terminus of the air route was then shifted to the Narvik area.

An airmail service was newly introduced in which two fieldpost carrying transports make weekly trips between Berlin and Tornio (Finland) in both directions.

These transports serve:

- a) In first priority, the forwarding of official and valuable mail (so far as this cannot be carried by the regular Lufthansa flights);
- b) The forwarding of letters and packages;
- c) The transport of two couriers of the 20th Mountain Army;

LUFFELDPOST SERVICE IN SCANDANAVIA (Cont.)

Airmail Service:

On the basis of a request by the Army Postmaster North, the Army High Command has ordered by the enclosed directive copy, the establishment of an airmail service in the operating area of the 20th Mountain Army from September onwards. Establishment of this service was made possible by increasing the deadweight loads for fieldpost of the Berlin-Konigsberg-Reval-Helsinki Lufthansa flight from 250 to 400 kilograms and conceding a load limit of 160 kilograms on the Helsinki-Stockholm-Berlin flight.

This service had restrictions to begin with, such that in the month of September only 6 and then after October, 8 permit stamps were issued to each qualified recipient - and that the zone of the rear area army was temporarily excluded.

(The next page, written September 6, 1943 was the initial announcement of the service):

Appendix 2 to the Operations
Report of Army Fieldpost Hdqtrs
for the month of Sept., 1943

An airmail service will be established for the 20th Mountain Army by which mail is to be transported by extension of the regular air route. Each member of the armed forces will receive 6 permit stamps monthly, of which 3 are to be used for mail from the front to the homeland and 3 for homeland to front replies. The issue of the stamps is staggered so that on each day only 1/30th of the monthly usage is issued by the fieldpost office. For official use, headquarters of the General Commands and higher will receive 80 stamps per month and the Division Staffs will receive 50.

Permitted will be:

a) Private mail:

Ordinary postcards and lettersheets with 1 stamp;
Ordinary letters up to 10 gram limit with 2 stamps;

b) Official mail:

Ordinary postcards and lettersheets with 1 stamp;
Ordinary letters up to 20 grams limit with 2 stamps;

Lettersheets with enclosures that exceed the weight limits are forbidden. Mail not meeting these provisions or that exceed the weight limits will be forwarded by ordinary means.

All airmail sendings that have the color-underlined routing indicator must be separated from the other posts by the fieldpost office and then dispatched.

It is interesting to note from our survey of known covers that while the required two stamps are found on ordinary letters in 1944, those dated after January 1, 1945 seem to consistently bear only one stamp - leading to a conclusion that the regulation was again changed at that point in time.

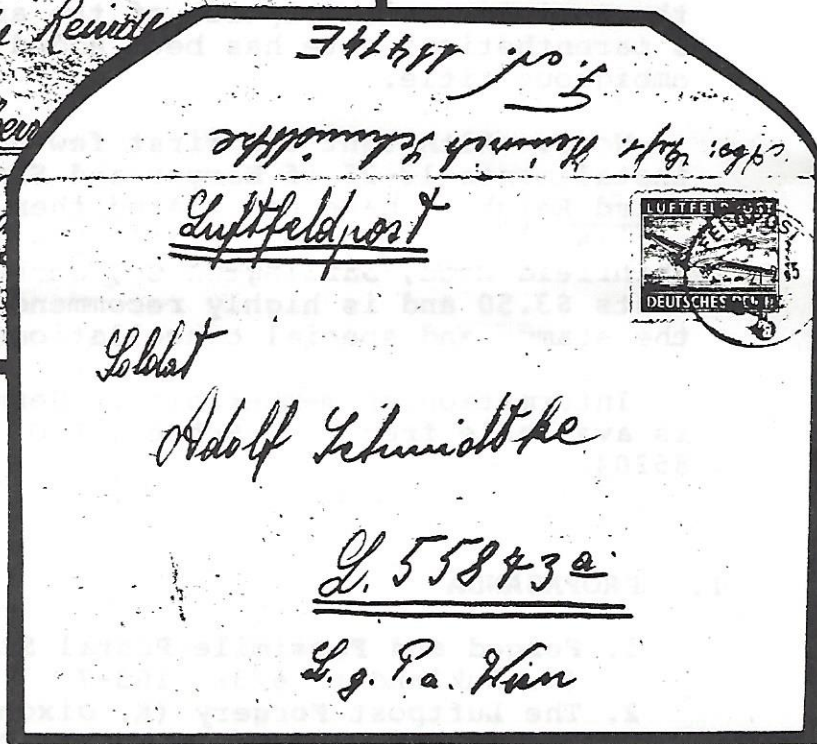
Illustrated herewith are examples of the subject airmail service to Northern Scandanavia:

Aug. 1, 1944: From Fp # 00974 (Army Sig. Rgt. 550, Btl. I) - using two stamps.



Feb. 27, 1945: From Fp # 11414E (Co. 4, Fusilier Btl. 199 of the 199th Inf. Div. at Narvik).

Many thanks are extended to R. Imus, F. Willshaw, H. McNemar and R. Gruenzner for the information which they sent in on applicable covers in their possession. It is odd to note that the earliest known is still August 1944 and it would seem that earlier ones must exist in light of the above report of September, 1943. Further reports from members with information on such covers would be greatly appreciated.

A SELECTED INDEX OF GERMANIA MAGAZINE

The following is an index of articles pertaining to Third Reich philately which have appeared in Germania, the magazine of the Germany and Colonies Philatelic Society (U.K.).

Individual entries consist of volume and issue, separated by a vertical bar; this identification is separated by a colon from the page reference i.e. 3/2: 113-22 refers to an article in Volume 3, issue 2 which appears on pages 113 thru 122. For signed articles, the author's name is given in parenthesis after the article or description of the article. In some instances, a parenthetical note has been added to more closely define an ambiguous title.

Note: Although the first few volumes of Germania contain installments 13-25 of Harper and Shenk's The Stamps of Germany Third Reich, I have not listed them as the complete work was published as a handbook and is available from Alf. Harper, 60 Whinfield Road, Darlington Co, Durham, England. The handbook costs \$3.50 and is highly recommended to those interested in the stamps and special cancellations of the period.

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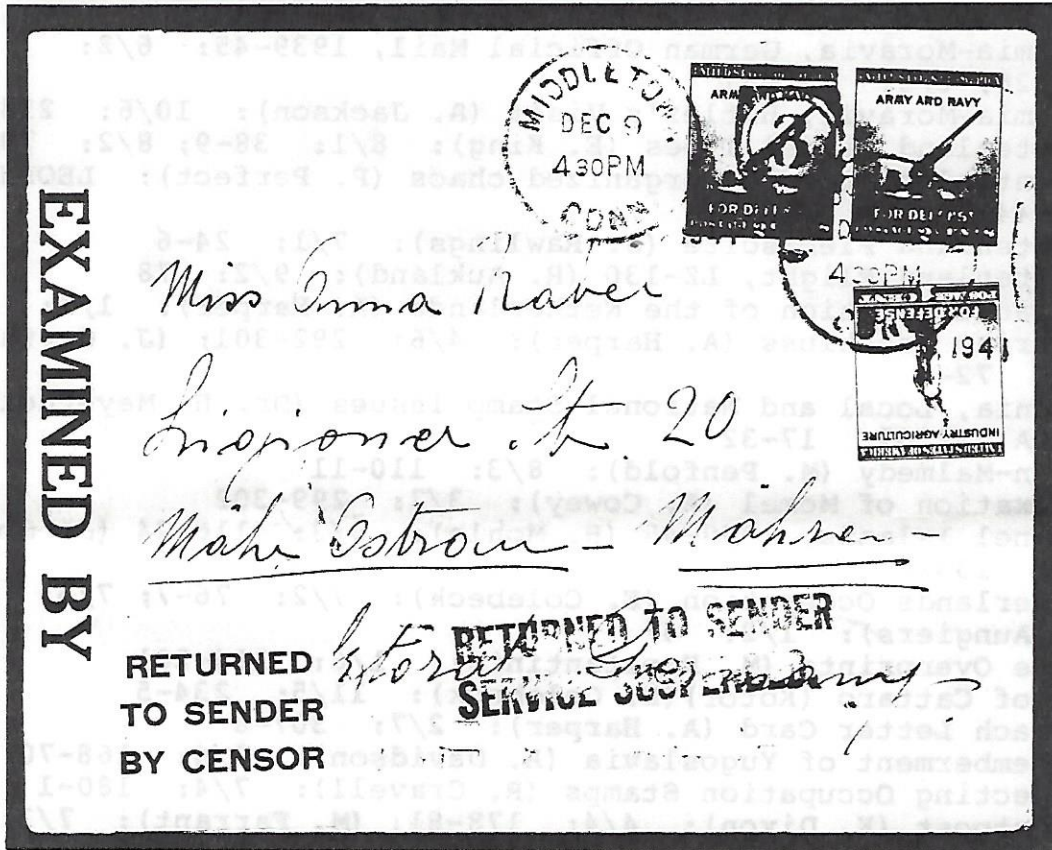

Suspension of Service to Occupied Europe

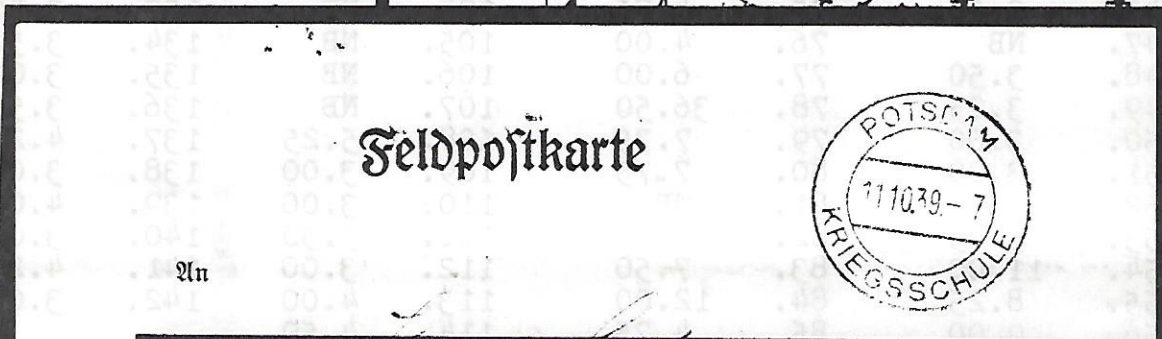
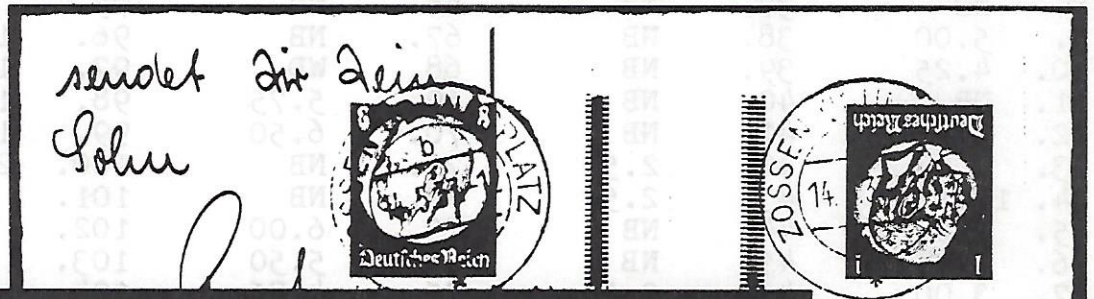


Addressed to the Protectorate of Bohemia-Moravia and posted December 9, 1941 from Middletown, Connecticut, this letter was returned to the sender with handstamp "RETURNED TO SENDER / SERVICE SUSPENDED" along with a square paste-on "RETURNED / TO SENDER / BY CENSOR". Markings on reverse side indicate return was not made until June, 1942 ! Less than two days after this letter was postmarked, Hitler was addressing the Reichstag, declaring war on the United States.

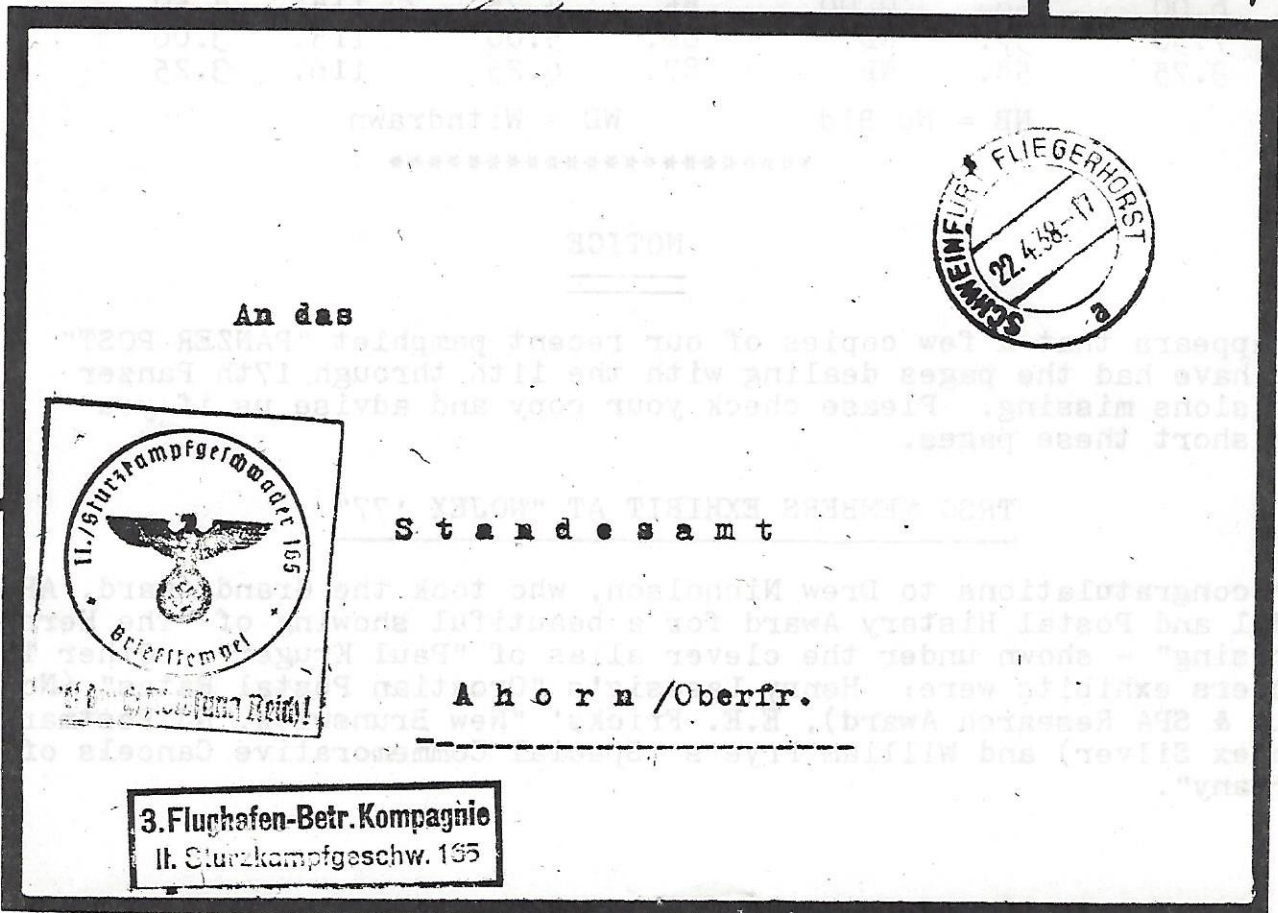

CANCELLATIONS OF P.O.'S AT MILITARY INSTALLATIONS

As a follow-up to the interesting article by R.H. Imus in Bulletin No. 44, Jim Lewis reports another such cancel in his collection from the Zossen Ubungsplatz dated May 14, 1937. Two more are reported by Bob Houston: Potsdam Kriegsschule and Schweinfurt Fliegerhorst. Note that the markings referred to are the postal cancellations normally found in the upper right corner and not the "Dienstsiegel" (unit seal) normally found in lower left of covers and cards. Ron Patterson also reports that the "Stockerau-Lager" cancel exists with code letter "b".
